As Program Director, Marquan successfully led initiatives and partnerships that helped residents achieve economic self-sufficiency, improved educational outcomes for children and promoted asset development through Individual Development Account and micro-loan programs.

Before joining FEP, Marquan gained clinical and macro practice experience in juvenile justice, community mental health, schools and foster care. Marquan served as an Executive board member for the United Way of Washtenaw County and most recently joined the board of IHN Alpha House (Family Shelter).

Marquan also served as a part of the Washtenaw County Task For Ending Chronic Homelessness Leadership Team. Marquan has been an adjunct professor at The University of Michigan School of Social Work, teaching both Social Work Research/Evaluation and Social Welfare/Policy courses.
